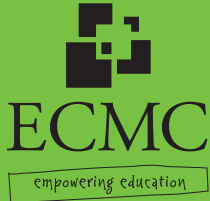

# REQUIREMENTS

Oregon students earn a diploma by completing at least 22 required credits. Additional credits may be required depending upon your local school district. While working toward a diploma, students have the option to also work toward earning a Certificate of Initial Mastery (CIM) and a Certificate of Advanced Mastery (CAM). These certificates are not required by Oregon for high school graduation.

## ADDITIONAL DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS THAT BEGIN WITH THE GRADUATING CLASS OF 2007

During 2001-02, the Oregon State Board of Education added to the content credits, specified in the box to the left, four new requirements for high school graduation starting in the 2006-07 school year. These four new requirements are integral in helping students master academic subjects and explore options beyond high school. In addition to the 22 or more credits listed to the left, a student must:

- ▶ **Develop an education plan and build an education profile.**  
This is a way for students to methodically identify personal, academic, and career interests and goals, to plan learning experiences that prepare students for steps after high school, and to track and document progress.
- ▶ **Demonstrate applied learning through a collection of evidence.**  
Students build a body of evidence that demonstrates the application and acquisition of skills and knowledge related to their interests and post-high school goals.
- ▶ **Demonstrate career-related learning knowledge and skills.**  
These include capabilities in personal management, problem solving, communication, and teamwork, along with knowledge about the workplace and career planning and advancement.
- ▶ **Participate in career-related learning experiences.**  
This enables students to connect classroom learning with experiences in the workplace, in the community, or in school relevant to their interests and post-high school goals.

# community college TRANSFER PROGRAMS

Many students start their college studies at a community college and later get credit for the courses when they enroll in a four-year college or university. If you plan to transfer to one of Oregon's four-year public universities, you may consider earning one of two "block-transfer" degrees offered in Oregon: the Associate of Arts/Oregon Transfer (AA/OT) degree and the Associate of Science/Oregon Transfer degree in Business (AS/OT-Bus). You should work closely with the community college academic advisers and the four-year colleges you plan to attend to ensure the correct "transferable" classes are taken.

Transfer policies to independent colleges and universities in Oregon may vary. You should contact the independent college you are interested in attending for more information about its transfer requirements. ## ASSOCIATE OF ARTS/ OREGON TRANSFER DEGREE (AA/OT)

All of Oregon's 17 community colleges offer the AA/OT degree. Students must complete a minimum of 90 credits, and at least 55 of those credits must meet general education requirements.

## ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE/ OREGON TRANSFER DEGREE IN BUSINESS (AS/OT-BUS)

The AS/OT-Bus degree is currently not offered at all community colleges in Oregon. You should contact the community college you plan to attend to determine if they

offer this degree. A minimum of 90 credits is required to earn this degree. At least 62-65 of those credits must meet a set of general guidelines, and another 14-17 credits must be earned based on business-specific requirements.

You also may transfer to one of Oregon's four-year colleges or universities based on having earned a minimum grade point average and completing a minimum number of transferable credits. The chart below shows the transfer admission requirements for students planning to transfer to one of Oregon's four-year public universities.

## DEGREE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMS

Oregon University System institutions work with community colleges to offer flexible academic options to students, commonly referred to as "degree partnership," "dual enrollment" or "co-admission" programs. College-to-university degree partnership agreements are student-focused arrangements that enable college students to be formally enrolled at both a community college and an Oregon University System (OUS) campus at the same time. ## HOW TO APPLY

### 1 Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon after Jan. 1 as possible.

The FAFSA is the doorway to all federal financial aid, including loans, grants, and work-study opportunities. Almost all financial aid depends on this important form for calculating a family's ability to pay for college. For example, all you have to do to apply for the Oregon Opportunity Grant is complete your FAFSA and make sure its results are sent to the college you will be attending. OSAC will determine your eligibility for the OOG based on the information you provide. Most OSAC scholarship programs will require the need information from the FAFSA as well.

### 2 Complete the OSAC Scholarship Application.

Both the paper and the online format are available each fall. We recommend you use the online application, available at [www.GetCollegeFunds.org](http://www.GetCollegeFunds.org). The deadline for submitting completed applications and materials is always March 1.

The Oregon Student Assistance Commission (OSAC) administers the Oregon Opportunity Grant (OOG), and more than 350 private and public scholarship programs. For 2008-09, the OOG offers almost \$72 million in awards for Oregon residents with financial need. OSAC public and private scholarships will offer nearly \$15 million. OSAC's Web site [www.GetCollegeFunds.org](http://www.GetCollegeFunds.org) has links to many other important scholarship and financial aid sites.

## OREGON OPPORTUNITY GRANT

### Expanded eligibility and more funding available in 2008-09

The Oregon Opportunity Grant (OOG) is the state's primary need-based form of student assistance. For 2008-09, OSAC will implement a new methodology, the Shared Responsibility Model, to make postsecondary education truly affordable for all

Oregonians. Funds totaling \$72 million will extend OOGs to more than 30,000 students (higher up the income scale) and increase average awards considerably.

The application process for the OOG program is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Oregon resident students who list an eligible

Oregon college or university among their choices to attend will be considered. OSAC determines student eligibility, and awards are disbursed to students via their campus financial aid awards. ## TIPS FOR COMPLETING THE OSAC SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

- ▶ **Include complete transcripts.** High school transcripts must include **seven** semesters or an equivalent (including course work for fall semester of your senior year) for you to be considered for OSAC scholarships. If your school reports grades by four quarters, make sure that your transcripts reflect the first two quarters of your senior year.
- ▶ **Identify your application properly.** Your name and last four digits of your social security number must appear at the top of every page in the application.
- ▶ **The postmark matters — postmark by March 1.** If the application is postmarked by the U.S. Post Office before or on March 1, OSAC accepts it. If the postmark is after March 1, it is rejected. There are no exceptions.  
  
**WARNING:** Do not rely on mail services or other delivery mechanisms: make sure the application is postmarked before or on March 1 yourself.
- ▶ **Keep a copy** of everything you submit for backup purposes and as a rough draft for next year.
- ▶ **Apply for scholarships every year you are in college.** As long as you remain an Oregon resident, you are eligible to compete for many of OSAC's scholarships. Apply every year by March 1.
- ▶ **Early Bird Program:** File by Feb. 15 to enter a drawing for a \$500 scholarship.

## PRIVATELY FUNDED SCHOLARSHIPS

OSAC partners with The Oregon Community Foundation, The Ford Family Foundation, U.S. Bank, Wells Fargo Bank, Bank of America, and other private donors, employers, and organizations throughout the state to establish these scholarships, which range from small, one-time awards for graduates of a single high school to large, renewable scholarships for students statewide.

## HOW TO APPLY FOR PRIVATELY-FUNDED SCHOLARSHIPS

### 1 Obtain an application.

Applicants can apply using either the Web-based or paper application. Both versions and the Scholarship Catalog, listing more than 350 programs, are available at the beginning of the school year. Paper applications and catalogs are available at all Oregon high schools, college financial aid offices, and online at [www.GetCollegeFunds.org](http://www.GetCollegeFunds.org).

### 2 Follow the directions carefully.

Your complete application must include a signed Application Form, an Activities Chart, answers to essay questions, and transcripts of all coursework through the fall term. You must also indicate the scholarships to which you wish to apply. Some programs require extra documents or information. Carefully read instructions and eligibility criteria for each program.

### 3 Submit a complete application packet by March 1.

The general deadline for all application packets is March 1. However, if you submit your complete application packet by the “Early Bird” priority deadline Feb. 15, you will be entered to win one of a number of \$500 Early Bird scholarships — just for following instructions and submitting early! In 2007, OSAC awarded 27 Early Bird scholarships. (Get a head start by going to the OSAC Web site and downloading the Activities Chart template for the application.)

## THE FORD FAMILY FOUNDATION

Oregon’s single largest private scholarship provider is The Ford Family Foundation, based in Roseburg, Oregon. Offering several different programs for students of all ages, the Foundation will award over \$9 million to college students in Oregon and California this year. Each year, the Foundation selects 300 new recipients from applicants whose past and potential are worthy of special support and development. These candidates demonstrate their understanding of the Foundation values of working hard, taking responsibility, giving back and helping others.

### Scholarship Programs offered by the Foundation:

**The Ford Scholars Program** – For graduating high school seniors and community college transfer students who plan to pursue a bachelor’s degree in Oregon.

**The Ford Opportunity Program** – For single parents who are heads of households and are pursuing a bachelor’s degree at an eligible Oregon college.

**The Ford ReStart Program** – For nontraditional adult students to begin or return to full-time postsecondary education in a certificate or degree program in Oregon. Preference is given to applicants with limited recent college experience.

**The Scholarship Program for Sons and Daughters of Employees of Roseburg Forest Products Co.** – For dependents of employees of Roseburg Forest Products Co. who are 21 years of age or younger. Applicants may attend any U.S. college.

Additional requirements apply to each program. Students with existing bachelor’s degrees are not eligible for Ford Family scholarships.

# OREGON 529 COLLEGE SAVINGS NETWORK

The Oregon 529 College Savings Network was created by the state of Oregon to offer three tax-advantaged Section 529 college savings options. All Network plans are administered by the Oregon state treasurer. These plans are the Oregon College Savings Plan, OppenheimerFunds 529 Plan, and the MFS 529 Savings Plan.

## **Oregon College Savings Plan**

The Oregon College Savings plan is managed by OppenheimerFunds, Inc., providing several investment and planning approaches. The Lifestyle Approach allows participants the highest degree of control over their account. The Years-to-College Approach will adjust a portfolio automatically the closer the beneficiary comes to entering college. The Single Fund Approach provides the participant the opportunity to establish a customized asset allocation. Participants may enroll in this plan directly.

## **OppenheimerFunds 529 Plan**

OppenheimerFunds, Inc. is the program manager for the OppenheimerFunds 529 Plan. Seven portfolios are available to choose from, ranging from aggressive to conservative. Participants must enroll in this plan through a financial adviser.

## **MFS 529 Savings Plan**

The MFS 529 Savings Plan is managed by MFS Investment Management. This savings plan provides participants with more than 20 investment options and three approaches. The Age-based Investment Approach considers how long the beneficiary has before entering college and transfers assets among four funds based on this time line. The Built-in Allocation Approach is a disciplined approach. The Customized Approach allows participants to create their own portfolio from among 20 investment mutual funds. Participants must enroll in this plan through a financial adviser.
