#### Did You Know?

Each contributor to your FAFSA (including you as the student) must provide consent for Federal Student Aid to obtain federal tax information automatically from the IRS to help you complete the FAFSA. Without consent, your FAFSA will be incomplete and you will not be eligible for federal financial aid. Students and contributors completing the FAFSA will be able to provide their consent directly through the form.
